MEETING MINUTES

I. Call to Order and Roll Call

The Arkansas Council for Military Children (Council) met Thursday, May 02, 2024. Chair John Kaminar called the meeting to order at 10:02 A.M.

A quorum was established.

II. Pledge of Allegiance (J. Kaminar)

Chair Kaminar asked Ms. Beth Jaime, the District Military Education Coordinator for Bryant Public Schools, to lead the Council members in the Pledge of Allegiance.

III. Recognition of Host School District (J. Kaminar)

Chair Kaminar thanked the Bryant School District for hosting this month's council meeting. Chair Kaminar gave a brief background of the Bryant School District. He stated that Bryant is one of the largest school districts in the state with nearly 10,000 students and with 211 military connected students at last count, they ranked 8th in the state for military connected students. Bryant is a recent Purple Star School District, having earned that distinction last May largely due to the efforts of Ms. Jaime. Chair Kaminar also pointed out that Bryant has a very active Air Force JROTC program. Chair Kaminar thanked and recognized several members of the district leadership, Dr. Karen Walters, Superintendent, Mr. Todd Sellers, Deputy Superintendent, Mr. Jeremy Lassiter, the Director of Legal affairs, Ms. Renee Curtis, the Director of Federal Programs, Ms. Devin Sherrill, the Communications Coordinator, Ms. Michelle Lewis, the Director of Student Services and Federal Programs, Ms. Janet Catlett, the ESOL coordinator, and Ms. Pam Kinney, the Assistant Superintendent for Elementary Education. Chair Kaminar presented a certificate of appreciation for Outstanding District Military Education Coordinator to Ms. Jaime and commended her for her service in that role.

IV. Introduction of New Members and Guests (J. Kaminar)

Chair Kaminar recognized members who are leaving the Council: Ms. Lorena Hegenbart is retiring and has resigned from the Council. She has served well for the last several years as the appointee for the president. Dr. Karla Nethery is accepting a new position with the Arkansas Association of Educational Administrators.

Chair Kaminar recognized new Council members: Senator Bart Hester has appointed Lieutenant Colonel James Garvey of the Arkansas Air National Guard. Chair Kaminar announced that Governor Sanders has appointed Ms. Jessica Saum to the Council.

Chair Kaminar introduced Mr. Jeremy Hilton, the Regional Defense State Liaison Officer for the South Central Region of the United States. Mr. Hilton has been in that role since 2021. He has worked in a variety of Family Services, community support and policy positions in the Department of the Air Force and Department of Defense. Chair Kaminar stated that Mr. Hilton would present to the Council shortly.

V. Approval of Agenda (J. Kaminar)

Chair Kaminar asked for a motion to approve the agenda. Ms. Reynolds has moved to approve the agenda as presented. Ms. Williams seconded. Without objection, the agenda was approved.

VI. Approval of Minutes (September 7, 2023) (J. Kaminar)

Chair Kaminar asked for a motion to approve the March 7, 2024 minutes. Ms. Bergstrom made the motion to approve the minutes as presented, seconded by Dr. Walker. Without objection, the minutes were approved.

VII. Public Comments (J. Kaminar)

Chair Kaminar recognized Col. Don Berry. Col. Berry requested that the Council reconsider the Student Advisory Committee per the comments he had shared with Chair Kaminar in an e-mail. Chair Kaminar said he will share that e-mail with the Council members.

VIII. Guest Presentation - Department of Defense Priorities (J. Hilton)

Mr. Hilton remarked that Arkansas is quite a bit ahead of many other states and the Arkansas Council is a great example of how to take care of our military families. Mr. Hilton stated the state liaison office works with policymakers at the state level, state legislatures and as well as the Governor's Office and the Executive Branch Agencies that work in every state. Mr. Hilton stated his region is all about quality of life and making sure service members and their families are taken care of. His office has helped to pass over 1000 different bills with the states' help to impact military families and their quality of life. Some current focuses are on K-12 education, employment, and workforce issues for service members, their families, as well as veterans. Mr. Hilton provided a website to contact either himself or his team members along with a list of the top ten policy priorities for 2024, 2025 and 2026.

IX. Chair's Report (J. Kaminar)

A. Purple Star School Banners

Chair Kaminar reported they have ordered Purple Star School banners paid for by the Division of Elementary and Secondary Education. He said he expected to receive 100 school banners and 10 district banners, which should get the Council caught up with the numbers of schools and districts in the state that haven't received their banners yet.

B. Student Advisory Committee

Chair Kaminar reported the Council has received three applications for the Student Advisory Committee and he anticipates receiving more in the coming days. The Council should be ready to vote on the first class of student advisors soon.

C. Outstanding Military Scholar Award

Chair Kaminar reported DESE has issued a press release about the Outstanding. Military Scholar Award.

X. Vice Chair's Report (A. Wright)

No report.

XI. Reports by the Committees, Task Forces, or Liaisons

A. Awards Committee (Dr. J. Walker)

Dr. Walker stated the next awards committee date is May 8, 2024.

B. Military Family Education Liaison (B. Olles)

Ms. Olles reported the scholarship application management system has launched, which is on the Arkansas Financial Aid website. She stated another great asset is the Explore Arkansas Careers website and it has some great information on picking a college based on the students' career goals, or if they are not wanting to go to college, where they can get some certifications. Ms. Olles reported the academic enrichment for gifted and talented students is providing some summer programs that are available for students in 7th through 12th grades. There is also an Arkansas AWARE training for schools over the summer. Ms. Olles stated food insecurity is one of the things that parents are faced with over the summer and provided a link to the Commissioner's Memo regarding the summer food program. Lastly, Arkansas Tech is offering some summer school college credits opportunities, \$150.00 for a three hour course.

C. Department of Defense Liaison (Col. N. Estelle)

Ms. Williams reported in Col. Estelle's absence. Ms. Williams thanked everyone for all the Purple Up events they hosted. They were able to attend 21 Purple Up events throughout the community in the month of April. It was a very successful Purple Up month.

D. Special Education Liaison (R. Porter)

Mr. Porter reported on the Enhancing Benefits documents, which cover some of the components of Special Education system, including the State Systemic Improvement Plan that included an effective dispute resolution process. Mr. Porter stated there are 17 indicators that they have to report to the federal government each year on their progress. He stated that next year there will be 18 indicators. The new indicator involves reporting identified non-compliance within the local education agency. Mr. Porter stated he might have some of the Special Education Staff attend a meeting to explain some of the technical assistance that they have available to support the local schools and support the students that are in those areas.

E. School Choice Advisor (D. Wood)

Mr. Wood reported as of May 2nd their office had received 4,835 new applications for the education freedom accounts. Of those 1,159, or almost 25% were from military connected families, which includes: active duty, reservists, National Guard and veterans. Mr. Wood stated Military connected families make up

almost one quarter of the new applications. Mr. Wood and Ms. Williams have done two presentations over the past month, one at Little Rock Air Force Base and another at Marshall Road Baptist Church. They will also be presenting at the Air Force Base on Tuesday, May 7th at 6:00 PM. They will also be presenting on Friday, June 7th, at Ebbing Air Force Base in Fort Smith.

XII. Old Business

A. LRAFB Focus Group (DESE)

Chair Kaminar stated that after some time, Secretary Oliva is ready to start a focus group to help solve issues in school districts serving the Little Rock Air Force Base. Chair Kaminar stated that Assistant Commissioner Darrell Smith would probably lead the group and that several DESE including Mr. Wood and himself, would participate, as well as representatives from several of the districts that serve the installation.

XI. New Business (J. Kaminar)

A. Annual Report to the Governor

Chair Kaminar presented the draft of the annual report that goes to the Governor, House and Senate Education Committees and the State Board of Education. Chair Kaminar asked for a motion to approve the report as presented, pending the inclusion of the missing bits of information and to send this report to the National Office of the Military Interstate Children's Compact Commission to fulfill our annual reporting requirement. Ms. Parker so moved; Dr. Schneider seconded. Motion carried.

B. Biennial Report to Joint Performance Review Committee

Chair Kaminar reported on the biennial report for the Joint Performance Review Committee of the State Legislature which is essentially an attendance report on council and committee meetings that were held. Chair Kaminar asked for the Council to review and vote on it at the next meeting.

C. Committee Rosters

Chair Kaminar presented a working roster of committee memberships. He stated they would like to have at least five voting members on each one of those committees, some of which have a couple of vacancies. Chair Kaminar will circulate a Google form for members to sign up. Chair Kaminar asked the Council to vote to approve the committees. He thanked Dr. Walker, Ms. Bergstrom, Ms. Reynolds and Ms. Wright for volunteering to chair the committees. Ms. Williams moved to approve the committees, seconded by Ms. Bergstrom. Motion carried.

D. Meeting Schedule for 2024-2025

Chair Kaminar presented the proposed meeting schedule for the upcoming year. Dr. Schneider moved and Ms. Reynolds seconded to approve the schedule. Motion carried.

E. Resolution for Military Spouse Appreciation Month

Chair Kaminar reported that May is Military Spouse Appreciation Month. He presented a draft resolution for the Council to consider adopting. Ms. Williams moved to adopt the resolution. Dr. Schneider seconded. Motion carried.

XIV. Date/Time/Place for Next Meeting.

Chair Kaminar stated that the next meeting would take place on July 18th, 2024, 10:00 AM, Professional Education Center of the Arkansas National Guard at Camp Robinson.

XV. Adjournment (J. Kaminar)

Chair Kaminar asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting. Motion made by Ms. Bergstrom, seconded by Dr. Schneider. No discussion. The meeting was adjourned at 11:10 a.m.

The Defense-State Liaison Office provides state policymakers with expert insight on issues affecting military families and their quality of life.


This is part of the Defense Department's efforts to identify and address the most pressing needs of service members and military families.

Public School Choice (Open Enrollment Flexibility)

- SB 458 by Senator English
- "Separating the public school district commitment from the housing decisions of uniformed service families by providing uniformed service families with a public school to public school choice option for their children relieves the conflict faced by the uniformed service families and maximizes the potential for educational success for children of uniformed service families."

Covers:

- 1. Uniformed service member on active duty,
- 2. Surviving spouses
- 3. Reserve component member in specific circumstances, and
- 4. Veteran returning to civilian status.

DoD State Policy Priorities – Emeritus



Sample "emeritus" priorities supporting families with exceptional needs:

- Advance Enrollment (2019-2022): Military children attend an average of 6-8 schools during their school life. Military families transferring on official orders are usually not eligible to register in courses, programs or lotteries for charter/magnet school entry until they are physically located within district boundaries. Schools could allow preliminary registration/enrollment or application pending relocation and waive proof of residence until the family moves.
- Purple Star Schools (2019-2023): Military children experience many challenges as they relocate to new schools due to a parent's change in duty station. By establishing statewide Purple Star Schools programs, states can encourage local education agencies to implement practices that assist military children with transitions/deployments and also recognize military service and civic responsibility.

Continuing: Concurrent Juvenile Jurisdiction

On military installations subject to exclusive federal jurisdiction, investigation and adjudication of juvenile offenses is limited because cases may only be adjudicated in the federal system. States can adopt concurrent jurisdiction policies to ensure access to state resources and juvenile courts for appropriate adjudication options to better respond to juvenile needs.

State Support for Military Families with Special Education Needs

- Problem: Highly mobile children, including military children, are more likely to experience recurring educational disruptions and challenges, particularly those who need access to special education and related services.
- Solution: States can assist by streamlining processes to ensure timely establishment of special education services and evaluations upon relocation and reducing burdens associated with due process proceedings.
- Intended Outcome: The end goal of this state policy priority is to minimize delays for military children with special education needs to receive services upon a PCS and reduce burdens for their parents if due process is needed.





State Support for Military Families with Special Education Needs Requirements

1. Minimizing Delays

- Require any required evaluations be conducted no more than 30 days after transferring into the school system.
- Clarify that existing advance enrollment policies apply to students with IEPs or 504 plans.
- States can provide support and funding to ensure the unique issues of military families and other highly mobile families are a focus area, increasing the likelihood of successful transitions.

• 2. Reducing Burdens

- Enact enhanced parental consent requirements related to eligibility,
 placement criteria and changes to services related to the transferring of IEPs or
 504 plans between school districts.
- Shift the burden of proof in due process cases to the school districts.
- Require reimbursement of expert witness fees in due process cases in which a hearing officer finds in favor of the parents.

Background

The Defense-State Liaison Office works with state policymakers to change laws and policies to improve military family well-being. Each year, the DSLO focuses on 10 key priorities. For each priority, the Military State Policy Source website provides background information, official Defense Department data and status updates on relevant information across states.

Purpose

Many priorities impacting the well-being of service members and their families are best addressed by state governments. In 2004, the undersecretary of defense for Personnel and Readiness established an outreach program through the DSLO to educate state policymakers on unintended barriers created by state policies and other priorities important to military families.

What We Do

The DSLO has eight regional liaisons who live and work in regions of the United States. The liaisons assist state policymakers by providing educational information, identifying "best practice" legislation, and presenting testimony when requested.

Track Record

DSLO has assisted state policymakers in enacting more than 1,150 bills since 2008 covering occupational licensure, employment protection, consumer protection, family law, child care, child protection, voting, education, health care and state judicial systems.

Working With State Policymakers to Support Military Families

2024 State Policy Priorities

Military Access to Quality Family Child Care: In many cases, DOD-certified military family child care providers must also be licensed or registered by the state when simply caring for DOD children. By recognizing military family child care certification, in lieu of requiring state licensing, states can enhance access to military child care and reduce the time on waitlists. States can also support Military Child Care in Your Neighborhood-PLUS, which increases access for active-duty, National Guard and reserve families.

Military Spouse Employment and Economic Opportunities: Many military spouse professionals must relicense each time they transfer with their active-duty spouse. As states implement the provision of the Military Spouse Licensing Relief Act, they can help military spouses maintain professional and financial stability by enacting licensing compacts and ensuring that licensing agencies make their application processes accessible to military spouses.

Defining Armed Forces in State Policy: Recent force structure changes require updates to ensure that states' definitions of military service align with federal law. States can minimize disruptions in benefits and services for eligible service members and dependents by clearly defining "armed forces."

Military Community Representation on State Boards and Councils: By including members of the military community, states can ensure that unique operational requirements and military family priorities are considered across pertinent policy areas.

State Support for Military Families With Special Education Needs: Highly mobile children, including military children, are more likely to experience recurring educational disruptions and challenges, particularly those who need access to special education and related services. States can assist by streamlining processes to ensure timely establishment of comparable special education services upon relocation and reducing burdens associated with due process proceedings.

Open Enrollment Flexibility: Military families are at a disadvantage when it comes to school enrollment options due to military-directed assignments. States can provide military families with improved schooling options by modifying open enrollment policies.

Child Abuse Identification and Reporting: Federal law requires the DOD to request state reports regarding instances of child abuse and neglect involving military family members. States can assist military Family Advocacy Programs in providing needed support by requiring child protective services to report cases to the military at the onset of their investigations.

Military Family Anti-Discrimination Status: To supplement employment protections under the Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act, states can add military family status as a class protected in state education, housing, public utilities and civil rights laws.

State Response to Military Interpersonal Violence: While the DOD has led the implementation of enterprise-wide guidance on prevention, states can address harmful behaviors, such as sexual assault and domestic violence, by expanding protections for victims. Enacting state policy best practices can supplement federal program efforts and changes.

Concurrent Juvenile Jurisdiction: On military installations subject to exclusive federal jurisdiction, investigation and adjudication of juvenile offenses is limited because cases may only be adjudicated in the federal system. States can adopt concurrent jurisdiction policies to ensure access to state resources and juvenile courts for appropriate adjudication options to better respond to juvenile needs.

Memo Text

The Arkansas Council for Military Children Student Advisory Committee (SAC) provides a means for children of military families to have direct, regular input to and interaction with the Arkansas Council for Military Children (the Council). The SAC consists of up to five students, one from each of Arkansas' four congressional districts and an at-large member from the Arkansas Military and First Responders Academy. The SAC will be supervised and mentored by members of the Council, two of whom will serve as Chair and Vice Chair of the SAC. The SAC will meet either in person or via web-based conferencing two to four times during the academic year.

Students interested in serving on the SAC apply during the spring of their sophomore year in high school. An ad hoc committee consisting of the Council chair, vice chair, and the chair of each of the Council's standing committees will review the applications and vote on whom to accept. Grades, discipline, attendance are considered by the selection committee.

Student advisors chosen as rising seniors are expected to serve for one year. Student advisors chosen as rising juniors are expected to serve for two years. During the first year of the program, the Council will choose two or three rising seniors for a one-year term of service and two or three rising juniors for a two-year term of service. In each subsequent year the Council will accept applications for the vacancies occurring as its senior student advisors graduate.

Any rising junior enrolled in an Arkansas public, charter, or private school whose parent, stepparent, or legal guardian is currently serving in the military is eligible to apply. The at-large student advisor from the Arkansas Military and First responders Academy must be also a student in good standing currently enrolled in JROTC at the Academy is eligible.

Students may apply online during the month of April. For the 2023-24 academic year, students may submit applications beginning April 1, 2024 through April 30, 2024. The application consists of three parts:

- Online application form submitted by the student.
- <u>Parental consent form</u> hand-signed by the student's custodial parent or legal guardian, submitted as an attachment to the student's application.
- Online endorsement submitted by the student's principal.

Each student advisor will receive credit for a minimum of six community service learning hours and a maximum of twelve community service learning hours per academic year with credit to be awarded as follows:

- One hour for each Council meeting the student advisor attends virtually.
- Two hours for each Council meeting the student advisor hosts or attends in person.
- One half hour for each Committee meeting the student advisor attends, including meetings of the SAC.
- One half hour for each semi-annual report the student advisor prepares and presents.
- One hour for participation in developing the addendum to the Council's annual report.

The Council chair will report each student advisor's community service learning hours annually to the student advisor's school district. Upon conclusion of the student advisor's term of service, the student advisor will receive a certificate of service from the Council and the opportunity to use Council members as references.

Each student advisor is expected to:

- Attend at least four Council meetings during the academic year, either in person or via webbased conferencing. Student advisors may participate fully in all discussions during Council meetings but may not vote.
- Host one Council meeting during the student advisor's two-year term of service. The meeting
 may be held at the student advisor's school or at another public venue approved by the
 Council.
- Serve as an advisor to one of the Council's standing committees other than the Student Advisory Committee.
- Promote activities for the Month of the Military Child in his/her school.

Collectively, the Student Advisory Committee is expected to:

- Present a written and verbal report to the Council at its November and May meetings.
- Provide a written addendum to the Council's annual report to the Governor, House and Senate Education Committees, and State Board of Education.

By submitting the endorsement form online, the student advisor's principal agrees to do the following:

- Excuse the student advisor's absence from school to attend Council or committee meetings.
- Award credit for community service learning as reported by the Council.
- Host one Council meeting on site during the student advisor's two-year term of service.

LITTLE ROCK — The Arkansas Council for Military Children is pleased to announce the creation of the Outstanding Military Scholar Award. This new award program, which will launch in 2025, will recognize one graduating senior who is the dependent of a current or former member of the armed forces or reserves.

In addition to demonstrating academic achievement, participation in extracurricular activities, leadership, and community service learning, eligible students must also attend a public or private school that is recognized by the council as a Purple Star School for its commitment to supporting students whose families are service members.

The Arkansas council is comprised of education and military representatives and joins all 50 states in reducing educational barriers for children of military families. An ADE representative serves as chair of the council and coordinates all meetings and activities.

"April is recognized as Month of the Military Child in honor of the sacrifices children of military families make," Arkansas Department of Education Secretary Jacob Oliva said. "These students and their families deserve our unwavering support as they move to Arkansas, and we are pleased

to be a part of recognizing remarkable students who excel despite transitions that may occur every few years."

This September, the council will host a series of online information sessions for parents and educators who want to learn more about the award program. Nominations for the award will open next January. The council will then select four finalists, with the winner announced in April 2025.

In addition to creating this award, the council will establish a student advisory group this fall that will be comprised of up to five juniors and seniors who will serve as non-voting advisors to the council. The council will begin accepting applications for the advisory group this month.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE ARKANSAS COUNCIL FOR MILITARY CHILDREN

TO THE GOVERNOR AND SENATE AND HOUSE EDUCATION COMMITTEES COVERING ACADEMIC YEAR 2023-2024

Statutory Requirements

Pursuant to the Arkansas Code Annotated (ACA) Section 6-28-204(f), the Arkansas Council for Military Children (hereinafter the Council) hereby submits this report to the Governor of Arkansas and to the Education Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives of the Arkansas General Assembly.

This report covers the period from July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024. Because this Council is concerned with the support of children of military families enrolled in Arkansas public schools, that time period is referenced in this report as Academic Year 2023-2024, or AY 2023-2024.

ACA 6-28-204 requires this Council to report on the following areas (excerpted verbatim from ACA 6-28-204(h):

- (1) Information regarding the achievements of the State Council and public school districts regarding the support provided to military families under this chapter;
- (2) Details of the reports provided to the Military Interstate Children's Compact Commission (MIC3);
- (3) The number of children of military families in each public school district transferring to or from another state or federal education agency in the previous year;
- (4) Summaries of cases elevated to the chair for counsel and assistance in resolving cases involving the transition of children of military families that were elevated by military families, United States Department of Defense officials; or Public school districts.
- (5) Information regarding training that is provided to public school district personnel with respect to this chapter
- (6) Details regarding plans for future engagement efforts with uniformed services families under this chapter; and
- (7) Any other information deemed relevant by the Council.

The Council has also decided to submit this report to the Secretary of Education and the State Board of Education and will submit this report to the MIC3 national office to satisfy the requirements of MIC3 Rule 2.102.

Executive Summary

The Council has enjoyed significant successes during the 2023-24 Academic Year. The Council has held two forums for military families, with the highest number of participants yet. This enabled the council to collect useful information about the needs of military families and to disseminate information regarding Education Freedom Accounts (available to all military families during the 2024-25 academic year). The Council has increased the number of Purple Star Schools statewide to 175. While this was short of the Council's goal of 200 Purple Star Schools, it did represent a 53% increase in the number of Purple Star Schools. The survey of the needs of military families which the Council conducted in the fall of 2023 yielded valuable information about the ability of military families to meet basic needs and has resulted in one recommendation by the Council for new legislation. The Council has expanded its outreach efforts by adding a non-voting advisor on school choice and has merged the Military Family Forum Committee with the Outreach Committee to enhance efficiency. The Council has created a Student Advisory Committee to receive direct input from high school students whose parent or guardian is currently serving in the military and to give these students experience serving with a state government council. Finally, the Council has created the Outstanding Military Scholar Award.

I. Achievements of the State Council and Public School Districts.

A. Military Family Forum.

The Council conducted an online forum on October 18, 2023. Two families attended.

The Council conducted an online forum on February 28, 2024 from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM. The forum included a guest presenter on Education Freedom Accounts. 27 families attended.

B. Recognition Programs.

The award to recognize Outstanding District Military Education Coordinators was approved for two individuals.

The Council created the Outstanding Military Scholar Award. This award will be presented annually to one graduating senior each year who is the child of a current or former member of the uniformed services of the United States, including the National Guard. Four finalists will be chosen through statewide competition, with one finalist selected as the state winner. The Council expects to receive nominations for the award beginning in January 2025 and then present the first award in the spring of 2025.

The Council created a "Military Kid of the Month" program. Children of military service members may be nominated by a school official. Recipients are selected by Council members. Selectees receive a certificate and are highlighted in the Council's monthly e-newsletter.

C. Purple Star Schools.

The number of schools qualifying for Purple Star School status has increased from 114 to 175. A sortable list of Arkansas Purple Star Schools is available at this link at this link on the Council web site. The number of school districts qualifying for recognition as Purple Star School Districts has risen from 13 to 19. Two charter school districts and six private schools have achieved Purple Star status. A sortable list of Arkansas Purple Star School Districts is available at this link on the Council web site.

The Council has revised the requirements to become a Purple Star School. Schools must now designate individuals to serve on their family and community engagement committees who will focus on issues for military families. The school must also address issues for military families in the school's engagement plan.

Last year the Council reported that lack of funding for Purple Star School banners was a hindrance to the program. In January 2024 the Division of Elementary and Secondary Education agreed to purchase banners for the Council.

D. Outreach and Training.

The Council has conducted seventeen online training sessions and one in-person training session for district military education coordinators and school military liaisons. Approximately 75 people received the training.

Council members staffed a discussion panel on engaging and supporting military families at the ADE Summit in Hot Springs on July 11, 2023. Approximately 30 people attended the panel.

Council members visited the Ebbing Air National Guard Station on March 2, 2024 to educate service and family members about Education Freedom Accounts.

Council members visited the Little Rock Air Force Base on two occasions to educate service and family members about Education Freedom Accounts.

Subscriptions to the Council's monthly e-newsletter have continued to increase.

- E. Survey. The survey of military families was open from September 7, 2023 through December 31, 2023. 255 responses were received. This was 31% reduction from the previous survey. The low response compared to the previous survey is attributed to the current survey's not being publicized through a Commissioner's Memo from DESE. Results of the survey are presented in **Appendix A**. The results indicate that a significant number of military families are experiencing some difficulty in meeting basic survival needs such as food and healthcare, especially in the enlisted ranks.
- F. Student Advisory Committee. The Student Advisory Committee will include up to five high school juniors and seniors chosen from Arkansas' four congressional districts and the Arkansas Military and First Responders Academy. The students must be children of currently serving members of the uniformed services. The Committee is chaired by the Council Vice Chair and mentored by three additional Council members. The Committee members will participate in Council meetings as nonvoting advisors and will provide input for the Council's annual report. The purposes of the Committee

are to enable the Council to receive direct, regular input from the children of military families and to provide students with an opportunity to learn about the operations of a state government body. The Committee will begin operations during the 2024-25 academic year.

II. Reports to the Military Interstate Children's Compact Commission.

The Council submitted the annual report to MIC3 required by the MIC3 Rule 2.102.

III. Children of Military Families Transferring Into and Out of Arkansas Public School Districts During AY 2023-2024

A table with data on the number of children of military families transferring into and out of Arkansas public school districts is at **Appendix B**. The data are provided by the Division of Research and Technology of the Division of Elementary and Secondary Education.

IV. Cases Brought to the State Council.

No cases under the Interstate Compact have been elevated to the Council during AY 2023-24.

V. Training for Public School District Personnel.

A schedule of training events conducted during AY 2023-2024 is at Appendix C.

VI. Plans for Future Engagement.

During AY 2024-2025 the Council will:

- A) Conduct at least one Military Family Forum, pursuant to ACA 6-28-204(f).
- B) Hold its regularly scheduled council meetings in various communities in order to facilitate in-person attendance by members of the public with a web-based option for persons who wish to attend virtually.
- C) Continue to conduct training statewide.
- D) Conduct a series of online sessions to provide information to parents and educators about the Outstanding Military Scholar Award.
- E) Conduct a series of online sessions to educate military family members about resources available to them.
- F) Increase the number of Purple Star Schools from 174 to 250.

- G) Implement the Student Advisory Committee.
- H) Implement a program to recognize cities and counties as Purple Star Communities.
- I) Conduct a needs survey of military families.

On March 15, 2024 Sen. Bart Hester, President pro Tempore of the Senate, appointed Lt. Col. James Garvey (Arkansas Air National Guard) to succeed Ms. Hegenbart.

On April 9, 2024 Governor Sarah Huckabee Sanders appointed Ms. Saum to the Council.

On May 16, 2024, the following three students were accepted as Student Advisors to the Council, with terms of service to begin on July 1, 2024:

1st Congressional District: Sonya Smith, Grade 11, Cabot High School
 2nd Congressional District: Madison Williams, Grade 11, Bryant High School
 3rd Congressional District: Weston Arnett, Grade 10, Alma High School

There were no applicants to serve as Student Advisors from the 4th Congressional District or from the Arkansas Military and First Responders Academy.

C. District Military Education Coordinators.

Currently 62 school districts in Arkansas are required to appoint a district military education coordinator under ACA § 6-28-116. Four school districts required to appoint a district military education coordinator are not in compliance with the statute. A list of school districts required to appoint a district military education coordinator is at **Appendix F**.

D. Recognition of Arkansas "Best Practices".

The Military Interstate Children's Compact Commission (MIC3) held its national Annual Business Meeting in Richmond, Virginia November 8 and 9, 2023. Col. (Ret.) Kaminar and Ms. Williams represented Arkansas at the meeting. Col. Kaminar was asked to present briefly on best practices in Arkansas. The presentation slides are at **Appendix G**.

VIII. Recommendations.

The survey of military families referenced in section _ above indicated that food insecurity is a problem for 19% of families responding to the survey. According to a <u>report released by the U.S. Department of Agriculture in October 2023</u>, Arkansas indicated a food insecurity prevalence of 16.6%, the highest in the United States. Additionally, <u>research conducted by the Military Family Advisory Network</u> indicated that in 2021 (the most recent data available), approximately 16.6% of military and veteran families were food insecure; 23.3% of enlisted families were food insecure.

It is the recommendation of this Council that legislation be passed to:

- a) Require all public school districts, including charter schools, to develop and publish annually a plan for addressing food insecurity among its student body.
- b) Require the Arkansas National Guard Family Readiness Program to develop and implement a plan for addressing food insecurity among Arkansas National Guard families.

SURVEY OF MILITARY FAMILIES FALL 2023

RESULTS

The Arkansas Council for Military Children (the Council) conducted a survey of military families during the fall of 2023. The purpose was to assess

- a) The familiarity of military families in Arkansas with various resources available to them and
- b) The ability of military families in Arkansas to fulfill basic needs.

The survey opened on September 7, 2023 and closed on December 31, 2023. The survey was announced via e-mail to the network of District Military Education Coordinators, school counselors, and school district family and community engagement coordinators. The survey was also publicized ion the Council's e-newsletter published on October 1, 2023, November 1, 2023, and December 1, 2023.

A total of 255 persons responded to the survey. Six responses included no information. 29 responses were supplied by individuals with no connection to the military. The remaining 240 responses (i.e., responses with a current or former connection to the military) are presented in the following pages.

The survey consisted of 28 questions. Question 9 consisted of 11 subquestions.

Questions 1 through 4 elicited demographic information on the respondents.

Questions 4 through 8 elicited information on the schools which the respondents' children attended.

Questions 9 and 10 sought to establish how familiar the respondents were with various organizations or services that support military families.

Questions 11 through 14 sought to determine the respondents' knowledge of and interaction with the Council. Please note that Question 14 appears out of sequence in this report in order to allow questions pertaining to the Council's military family forum to appear on the same page.

Questions 15 through 19 sought to determine the respondents' knowledge of and interaction with the Military Interstate Children's Compact Commission.

Questions 20 through 23 elicited information about the respondents' use of school choice.

Questions 24 through 30 elicited information about the respondents' use of advance enrollment and virtual enrollment opportunities.

Questions 31 through 38 elicited information about the respondents' ability to fulfill basic needs.


The results of this survey indicate the following:

- a) Significant numbers of military families in Arkansas are unaware of many of the resources and organizations that exist to support them.
- b) Significant numbers of military families were unable to fulfill some basic needs (medical care, child care, and food).
- c) Inability to fulfill basic needs was more prevalent among reserve component service members than among active duty service members.
- d) Inability to fulfill basic needs was more prevalent among enlisted members, especially among noncommissioned officers, than among commissioned officers and warrant officers.




1. Military Status of Respondents (240)




