National Meeting Notes:

All 50 States have joined (KS was the 1st State to adopt. 4/9/08) 1 of 4 Compacts adopted by all 50 states Can now focus on strategic planning and providing services

By-Laws were amended to add past-chair to exec committee

Legislative Issues:

- Because of block grants, enrollment counts do not determine funding, including Military 2nd Count.
 KSDE will continue to identify military students, but it won't collect a second count.
- State aid is locked in for next 2 years, regardless of local revenue, including Impact Aid Concerns: This year, US Dept of Ed paid schools several back years of impact aid payments. This increases impact aid and lowers state aid. Next year, districts will receive a normal impact aid distribution, but state aid is locked in at the current year's number. Bill Heinen, Keith Mispagel and Corbin Witt plan to meet with the Governor's staff to talk about the unforeseen consequences in the new block grant formula. The Extraordinary Need State Aid program may be an option to help.

New 2016-17 contracts will result in the transfer of additional military families to McConnell. Derby may see an increase in military student enrollment, without any increase in funding.

KSBE Community Conversations

Randy Watson and Brad Neuenswander would like to schedule a meeting with military staff and superintendents from military impacted districts to discuss what high school graduates should know and be able to do before entering the military. School liaison officers will serve as the contact to schedule participants (recruiters, officers, etc.) for this discussion.

April: Month of the Military Child

Districts have scheduled a wide variety of activities in recognition. April 15 is "Purple Up" for Military Kids day.

Other Issues

The Compact Rules Desk Reference for Principals will be distributed at budget workshops in June.

Not all states require an IEP for participation in gifted programs. This can create difficulties in providing comparable educational programs for students transferring to Kansas.

The positive benefits of identifying students as children of military families are not understood by all school districts, nor by all parents.

Collecting impact aid applications is a challenge for some districts. Keith Mispagel volunteered to share strategies for accomplishing this task.
