The EDOE website has been undeted to reflect a total of 107 Dymle Stor Schools of Distinction		

- The FDOE website has been updated to reflect a total of 197 Purple Star Schools of Distinction in Florida.
- The Bureau of Family and Community Outreach (BFCO) team has developed a plan to share best practices among the Purple Star Schools. The plans include quarterly virtual opportunities via webinar to share best practices through district points of contact as well as a specific opportunity for prospective Purple Star Schools to receive technical assistance on the requirements and the application process. The team will work with Ms. Hopkins to ensure the Council is included in the communication when specific dates and links are shared.
- Holiday Heroes Project BFCO was honored to participate in Lt. Governor Nuñez's initiative, Holiday Letters for Heroes, in December 2023. Students from Florida's public, charter and private schools were encouraged to write letters and send artwork thanking our Florida National Guard for their service. BFCO supported this project by coordinating the receipt and processing of more than 40,000 letters sent in by students of all ages. The letters brought joy to the guardsmen and women. Bureau Chief Cole stated that BFCO was happy to have been a part of this process and wanted to thank everyone who participated.

### Purple Star Schools of Distinction Reflection Elisa Jannes, Principal, Sigsbee Charter School, Monroe County School District

- Elisa Jannes, Principal of Sigsbee Charter School, shared photos of her school, which has steadily increased in enrollment. School staff welcomes all students, with special considerations for military families. They developed a lottery system for enrollment that always accommodates military families. All communication is online so parents can see newsletters. Principal Jannes described her town as a small community with a very close relationship with schools and the military. For example, military personnel welcome students on the first day of school.
- Sigsbee has served 14 years as a charter school. Their connection with students is through place-based education (marine lab, kayak elective, Everglades, Dolphin research center, etc.).
- Wounded Warrior Project Students create welcome packages for them. The Month of the Military Child is celebrated in April.
- Compact Commissioner McCaffrey thanked Principal Jannes for her dedication to military students.

### **Updates from the Military Family Education Liaison**

### Lisa Hill, Military Family Education Liaison

- Mrs. Hill will be working with school liaison officers (SLOs) to document an outreach plan ensuring continued education for stakeholders in the MIC3 program.
- SLOs are already active in MIC3 outreach through their close partnerships with school districts, military installations and families.
- Mrs. Hill will document a plan for military contacts to use to disseminate and receive information via social media pages, briefings, trainings, websites, etc.
- The National MIC3's new online training portal is an excellent educational resource. SLOs will look into adding the portal link to military family sections on school websites.
- The Outreach Plan will address reaching families/stakeholders living further away from larger school districts and military installations.

### **Updates from the National Office**

### Cherise Imai, MIC3 Executive Director

- The annual meeting was held in Richmond, VA, and Florida continues to be a leader in supports for military-connected students and families.
- The Compact 101 webinar is still available for free at https://mic3.net/mic3training-net.
- Toolkits were updated and launched for parents.
- Ms. Imai will spend the next year evaluating training programs to make sure they are effective.

### **Updates from School Liaison Officers**

- Sharon Kasica shared that there are potential issues with the Step Up for Students scholarship funding organization because there should be open enrollment for military families throughout the year. The requirement in <a href="section 1002.394(8)(a)4">section 1002.394(8)(a)4</a>. Florida Statutes, is that no students may be submitted to the Department after February 1, 2024. The application window was closed so that the scholarship funding organizations would have an opportunity to review all applications and supporting documentation, including further correspondence with families if necessary, and provide the final list by the deadline.
- Lacey Allen, the new regional Air Force school liaison from Hulbert Field, was introduced.
