MILITARY INTERSTATE CHILDREN'S COMPACT COMMISSION

The Military Interstate Children's Compact was developed in 2006 and has been adopted by all 50 states, the District of Columbia and the Department of Defense Education Activity. The Compact eases the educational challenges that military children encounter, and supports uniform treatment as they transfer between school districts.

The Compact only applies to public schools.



Compact Quick Fact Guide

Goal of the Compact

To overcome transitional issues experienced by military families when their children move to a new school in another state.

Member States

All states and the District of Columbia.

Applies to

Active duty members of uniformed services including the National Guard and Reserve members on active duty orders pursuant to 10 U.S.C. §1209 and 1211, as well as veterans who are severely injured and medically discharged for one year after medical discharge or retirement, and veterans who die on active duty for a period of one year after death.

Educational Records

Receiving member states must accept unofficial records for initial enrollment and then the sending member state must submit official records within 10 days of receipt of the request for records.

Immunizations

A child who is unable to provide official documented proof of at least one dose of each required vaccination must be automatically enrolled and/or homebound services will be provided within 3 days, to ensure educational services are immediately provided while the first dose(s) of all required immunizations are confirmed. Note: Tuberculosis testing is currently not required for enrollment in WV schools.

Kindergarten and 1st Grade Entrance Age

A student who moves may continue in the same grade in the receiving state regardless of the entrance age requirements of the receiving state.

Course and Educational Program Placement

School districts must initially honor equivalent course enrollment or program placement (ex. Gifted, AP, etc.), if available. Then, evaluation may occur to ensure appropriate placement. Space must be available, and member states must demonstrate reasonable accommodations.

Special Education

Receiving schools must use the sending state's IEP until a new IEP may be conducted/ evaluated.

Placement Flexibility

The Compact encourages schools to waive course prerequisites as appropriate to the content, when similar coursework was completed (ex. Requirement to pass Geometry before taking Algebra).

Absence Related to Deployment

The Compact establishes guidelines for enhanced flexibility with excused absences for military families on active duty orders (one month before deployment and six months after return).

Enrollment

During deployments it may be necessary for students to stay with a non-custodial parent or someone in loco parentis. Guardianship of a student under these circumstances should not prevent or negatively impact enrollment (a power of attorney is sufficient). The family may keep their school as long as the guardian provides transportation.

Extracurricular Participation

Deadlines for application are not grounds for disqualification. The school must demonstrate reasonable accommodation, but is not required to hold open or create additional space on teams.

Course Waivers

Substituting equivalent coursework is required (ex. West Virginia History for Ohio History). Reasonable justification is required for denial of a course waiver.

Transfers as a Senior in High School

The receiving state works with the sending school district to issue a diploma, if the student is a senior in High School (ex. using a memorandum of understanding between schools).



Importance of MIC3 in WV

- Military children transition between 6-9 times during K-12.
- Soldiers experiencing deployments can focus on missions knowing provisions protect their families.
- The participation of every state in the Compact supports military readiness across the nation.
- Soldiers with families transitioning from other states into West Virginia receive reasonable accommodations provided by Compact.
- Soldiers from West Virginia transitioning into other states for the completion of their active-duty military orders are supported by other states participating in the Compact.

MIC3 Annual Business Meeting (ABM)

- Meeting in 2024, was Albuquerque, NM.
- Meeting in 2025, will be Indianapolis, IN.
- Approval of the FY 2026 budget
- Procedural votes occurring on bylaws and rules amendments, etc.
- A five-year strategic plan was discussed



MIC3 Annual Business Meeting (ABM)

- MIC3 National Policy requires two years of operating expenses be secured in reserves. In FY 2026 it is projected reserves will not be met.
 - Dues may increase from \$2,300 to \$4,000 in FY 2027 (2nd dues increase since 2008)
 - At next year's ABM, proposal to rotate in-person and virtual ABMs every other year considered
- West Virginia identified as compliant in FY 2024
- States still encouraged to make technical corrections to existing MIC3 Compact language





Cases Reported to the State and Qualifying for Provisions of MIC3:

FY 2020 - 1

FY 2022 – 0 (1 inquiry reported, did not qualify)

FY 2024 – 0 (1 inquiry reported, did not seek qualification)

FY 2025 - 1





Qualifying Inquiry – Occurring FY 2020

Issue: A student moved from WY to WV with a high school level integrated science course completed, but high school equivalency was not identified on the transcript and the name of the course did not match Earth and Space Science, which was a required prerequisite in WV for the student to begin Biology I at the appropriate grade level.

Resolution: The student received course credit equivalent to Earth and Space Science at the high school level in WV, allowing enrollment in Biology I at the appropriate grade level.

Qualifying Inquiry – Occurring FY 2025

Issue: Family requested educational services during the 30-day period for immunizations.

Resolution: Family received educational services during the 30-day period. Family moved to another state near the end of 30 days, no longer needing provisions in West Virginia.







Military Signing Week and Spirit Week on April 7-11, 2025

Purple Up Day on April 11, 2025



This year for the first time ever, the state-recognized Spirit Week and Military Signing Week take place during the same week, culminating with Purple Up Day. The WVDE launched a Purple Up Month Toolkit for educators, which you may access by <u>clicking here</u>. It offers a wide variety of helpful ideas for activities and templates promoting participation, including this year's <u>Spirit Week poster</u>.

Registration for schools hosting Military Signing Week and related events launched on December 9th. Already, 23 schools have signed up to identify their local events on the Common Ground Partnership's website and receive useful planning templates. West Virginia Schools Receiving the Purple Star Award in 2021-2022 = 200

- Schools participating in the survey = 179
- Schools not participating in the survey = 21 (3 schools closed)

School administrators and military family points of contact at these schools which responded to the survey = 76 administrators and 127 military family points of contact

- Not Useful and/or informative = 0%




Has a military-connected child at your school experienced a deployment of a family member or school transition due to military orders during the award period (2021-2024)?

CIVIL AIR PATROL

As a non-profit auxiliary of the U.S. Air Force, students participating in this program contribute to a real-life mission in service to the public. Cadet members of the West Virginia Wing learn about leadership, are immersed in aerospace education and mentored in physical fitness. AEROSPACE EDUCATION MEMBER (AEM) PROGRAM FOR EDUCATORS

The Civil Air Patrol's Aerospace Education Member (AEM) program is designed to support education in grades K-12. Educators who become members may use an online portal to request STEM kits with lesson plans which can be integrated into classroom instruction and kept by the school upon completion of activities. Teacher orientation program (TOP) flights are offered in aircraft stationed at local airports to educators who are members of the AEM program. AEM members may participate in one TOP Flight per fiscal year (1 Oct - 30 Sept) in powered or glider aircraft where available and as funding allows. 
