

Dr. Brian Henry Compact Commissioner MIC3 Missouri

Dr. Brian Henry is the Missouri State Commissioner for the Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children. He was appointed in 2014 and has served as the Finance Committee Chair/Treasurer for MIC3 and the Communications and Outreach Committee Chair.

Dr. Henry became superintendent of the Waynesville R-VI School District on July 1, 2014. Prior to his appointment to this position, he served as Waynesville's assistant superintendent of instructional services, overseeing curriculum for the district's 6,000 students, professional development for teachers, the Professional Learning Community (PLC) process, and Missouri State Learning Standards. He spearheaded efforts that led to Waynesville High School being the first in the State of Missouri to implement a college readiness program from the National Math and Science Institute, led district efforts to obtain the only Defense Community Infrastructure Grant in Missouri, and served on numerous committees to promote the needs of military students.

Since retiring as a superintendent after 30 years of service in Missouri Schools, Dr. Henry worked for the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education and as State Supervisor of Instruction in the Kansas City Region. After working for the department for two years, Dr. Henry accepted a faculty position at the University of Missouri in the Educational Leadership and Policy Analysis Department.

A native of the Kansas City, MO, area, Henry was an education major at Missouri Valley College before earning a master's degree in education from Baker University and a Doctor of Education degree from the University of Kansas in 2004.





Dr. Henry and his wife, Dr. Kristina Henry, have four daughters: Morgan, Madison, Mollie, and Mary, and two grandsons, Denny and Bennett. Dr. Henry and his family reside in Kansas City, MO.
