Tony Trongone joined Pemberton Township Schools as superintendent in July 2015. Before coming to Pemberton, he served as superintendent of schools for Berlin Borough and Gibbsboro Public Schools, a post he held for five years. His previous experience includes serving as district supervisor of curriculum and instruction for Cherry Hill Public Schools, math facilitator for Gloucester City School District, and secondary mathematics teacher at Northern Burlington Regional High School in Columbus, NJ.

Trongone earned his master's degree in Educational Administration from Wilmington University and his BA in Mathematics with honors from Rutgers University. He prescribes to the theory of "high challenge with high support," believing all students can learn and it is the responsibility of educators to support students in reaching their fullest potential. He is committed to providing Pemberton students with a rigorous instructional program and multiple pathways to college and career readiness.

He is currently a member of the New Jersey Association of School Administrators Legislative Committee, on the board of directors for the Educational Services Commission, and has served as president-elect of the Association of Mathematics Teachers of New Jersey.
