# Remarks from the State Superintendent of Schools

 Superintendent Roach's commended the council for all they do not only for military children but all children. He expressed appreciation for first responders and military members. He noted the partnership with the WVDE has an ongoing vision including all parties involved making sure military members know their children and all children are taken care of. He ended by saying we (the WVDE) is ready and willing to do anything to help.

### • Military Interstate Children's Compact Commission (MIC3) Overview

- Mr. Mellace shared the following information
  - Summary Information
    - MIC3 was developed in 2006 and adopted by all 50 states. It is in WV State Code. The Compact eases the educational challenges that military children encounter and supports uniform treatment as they transfer between school districts. The Compact only applies to public schools.
    - Compact Quick Fact Guide available

- Importance of MIC3 in WV
  - Military children transition between 6-9 times during K-12. The Compact provides military members assurance that their children will have smooth transition between public schools.

# Roundtable Discussion on MIC3 and Additional Supports for Military Families

- Mr. Cantrell express that the WVDE and National Guard work well together. Major General Crane is supportive of anything the National Guard can do to support education. That support is two-fold from the National Guard, they want to help our children, but they also want the best and the brightest to join the military. They realize that military members may not know how to inject themselves into schools properly and there may be some missed opportunities for support. He is open to ideas on how we can do better. He commended Mr. Mellace for his presentation.
- Superintendent Roach reciprocated the positive relationship between the National Guard and the WVDE. And reiterated that if there is anything the WVDE can do to assist the National Guard's efforts they would be happy to do so.
