National Guard Mission

To maintain properly trained and equipped units, available for prompt mobilization for war, national emergency, or as otherwise needed.



National Guard Statuses

- **Title 10:** Service Members fall under Title 10 of the US Code; (active duty Service members). In the Guard, it means they are ordered Federal active duty
- **Title 32 Full Time National Guard Duty:** Federal active duty for specific state missions, training, and full-time Guard positions; under control of the state
- **State Active Duty (SAD):** Activated by Governor for disasters or homeland defense missions (paid by state)
- **M-Day:** The majority of CANG Guard members are M-Day; perform weekend drill once per month, and 2 weeks of annual training each year.



Unique Challenges

- State and Federal Missions
 - Increased number of missions
 - 10.5K of the 18K Army and Air National Guard members were activated in past 20 months.
 - COVID missions, civil unrest, border security, wildfire missions
- Wear the same uniform and do the same job, but don't qualify for many of the same benefits
- Have civilian jobs in addition to military commitment (Citizen Soldiers)
