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## Accomplishments:

- -The Florida Council supported the establishment and implementation of the Purple Star Schools of Distinction program through the Florida Department of Education.
- -The Florida Council assisted and provided wording for the Governor's proclamation of April as the Month of the Military Child in Florida.
- -The Florida Council recognized departing staff with national MIC3-level recognition, particularly departing Senior Chancellor Jacob Oliva.
- -Supported awareness for school district superintendents of Florida Senate Bill 662, which amended Florida Statutes that military orders are enough to establish residency for transferring military families who do not have a permanent address yet.
