The purpose of the Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children (ICEOMC), also called the “Compact,” is to remove barriers to educational success imposed on children of military families due to frequent moves and a service member’s deployments.

All 50 states and the District of Columbia have signed legislation to become part of the Compact. In 2017, the Department of Defense (DoD) joined the Compact by signing a memorandum of understanding and adopting the DoD Instruction 1342.29. This means military kids are covered by the Compact regulations when transitioning between public or Department of Defense Education Activity (DoDEA) school.
