Ms. Terri Jones serves as an Army School Liaison Transition Specialist at Headquarters, Army Installation Management Command (IMCOM), Directorate of Family, Morale, Welfare and Recreation (DFMWR), Child and Youth Services (CYS) in San Antonio, Texas. In this role, she provides enterprise-level leadership, training, and support to Army School Liaisons across all installations. She is responsible for developing and delivering comprehensive training programs that equip School Liaisons with the knowledge and resources necessary to effectively support military-connected students and their families during school transitions.

Ms. Jones brings over 16 years of experience as a School Liaison Officer and 11 years as an educator. Prior to her current position, she served as the Child and Youth Services School Liaison at Fort Hood (now Fort Cavazos), Texas, where she partnered with two fellow liaisons to support nine surrounding school districts serving more than 25,000 military-connected students. Her efforts focused on strengthening partnerships with local education agencies, educating school administrators and staff on the Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children, the Purple Star Schools Program, resources for homeschooling families and many other support services. She also led the Youth Sponsorship Program across more than 25 campuses and taught resiliency skills to student sponsors in the Fort Hood Army Teen and Middle School Programs.

A proud Army spouse and daughter of an Air Force veteran, Ms. Jones personally understands the challenges of frequent school transitions, having experienced them both as a child and as a parent. She earned her Bachelor of Science in Education from Midwestern State University in Wichita Falls, Texas. Her deep personal connection to military life, combined with her extensive professional experience, drives her continued commitment to ensuring seamless educational transitions and support for Soldiers and their families.
